## **New Canaan Library Announces Elections of New Board Members**

"Our Board of Trustees is a uniquely dedicated team of community leaders committed to providing New Canaan with a world class library service for today and for the future," said Executive Director, Lisa Oldham. Board President, Bob Butman, added "Over the past several months, we have been honored to welcome this great group and to harness their considerable talents and experience. They are joining the New Canaan Library Board at a very exciting and dynamic time, and we look forward to their valuable contributions."

The Library Board can now seat up to 25 members, up from 18 seats in prior years, a recent change that reflects strong interest in Board membership and the widely recognized importance of the new Library building project. "We have been actively recruiting new Trustees and interest has been stronger than ever, given the widespread excitement about our building project," stated Christine Seaver, Vice President.

**Rachel Baker** is a graduate of Ohio Wesleyan and Seton Hall Law School. She and her husband, Chris, are the parents of two daughters who both attended New Canaan Country School. She is a longtime community and Library volunteer, has been a board member of Ohio

Wesleyan University, and has been an active volunteer for Horizons, the New Canaan Charity League, the New Canaan Garden Club, and the Fresh Air Fund. Ms. Baker has taken on the role of Board Secretary, noting "This Library is a beacon for families – we could no sooner imagine a world without libraries than a world without schools. It has been more than a joy to be part of this mission and our family is grateful for the opportunity to serve and support this Library and the coming new building whose benefits we truly understand as something that will outlive our generation and reach far into the future."

**Gary Engle**, CEO and Chairman Stoneleigh Capital. Mr. Engle has been an active and successful investor internationally across many industries including commercial shipping, equipment finance and real estate. He has held numerous corporate board positions. A graduate of U Mass - Amherst and Harvard Business School, Gary lives in New Canaan with his wife, Dao, and their middle-school age son; their older son is at Taft.
